



## An Introduction to Bobbin Lace

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## Supplies

Curriculum for Class: Order the required curriculum from The Lace Museum for \$25 including shipping at [thelacemuseum@gmail.com](mailto:thelacemuseum@gmail.com).

An 18 or 20-inch (45-50 cm) firm cookie pillow, covered, or a block pillow, or a roller pillow.

Approximately 16-inch (40 cm) square of non-skid shelf liner for securing a lightweight pillow

12 pairs of bobbins (24 bobbins) any style

Bobbin holder for 12 (or more) pairs of bobbins

Lacemaking pins, approximately 30 x .60mm to 30 x .70mm\4-6 divider pins (or glass-headed pins)

Pincushion; Two cover cloths

DMC Perle cotton 8, or Lizbeth 20, or linen 35/2 or 40/2 with approximately 17 wraps/cm in 6 to 10 bright colors: at least 20 yards of each color

Pricker or pricking vice with a needle; A pusher/puller for pushing in or pulling out pins

The prickings printed on light grey, blue or green 90 to 110 lbs. weight cardstock, included in the curriculum

A table at a comfortable height, such as a computer table or a tray table, which allows your lower arms to be parallel to the floor when you make lace.

Scissors for paper, Scissors for thread, Pencil

3-ring binder with note paper and plastic sleeves for this manual and the finished lace

**Technical:** It is highly recommended that you have a fairly large size computer monitor, such as a desktop, laptop, iPad or tablet for viewing the demonstrations, plus a camera, such as your phone camera mounted over your work. That will allow you to get feedback on your work from the teacher. **A practice session for the technical setup will be scheduled a week or more before the first class.**
