**Invisible – hidden starts and finishes in bobbin lace**

**24, 25, 27, 28 July, 2023**



## **Supply List:**

Please prepare these materials:

- Bolster pillow or flat pillow
- 10 pairs of bobbins (Wind 120 inches on the first bobbin of a pair and only 20 inches on its partner bobbin. All 10 pairs are wound this way.)
- For lacemaking I recommend Londonderry thread #80/3 or Goldschild Linen NeL80/3 (dD 30) in one or two colors. This thread may be difficult to source in the US; it is available from Holly van Sciver
- 8 Lazy loops in three light colors, for example: light blue, light red and light green each thread 23 inches long. You may take machine sewing thread in cotton or silk, avoid Polyester. The thread has to be finer than the lace thread. We prefer tatting cotton #80 from DMC, or Anchor in Europe.
- Pins without a glass head, normal pins.
- Napkin to cover parts of lace on a flat pillow.
- Contact to cover the prickings; Blue self-adhesive foil to cover the prickings or print the pricking on blue cardboard
- Pair of scissors for paper and a very sharp one for threads
- Crochet hook number 0.6 or 0.75
- Printed documents with lace prickings ( I send them in pdf-format 2 weeks in advance)
